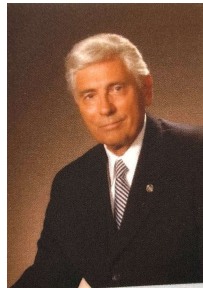

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES:

On January 29, Jane Timken was sworn in as Ohio State Senator for District 29 in Stark County by Chief Justice Sharon Kennedy using the bible of the late Senator Kirk Schuring. "It is a great honor, and I will do my best to represent Stark County with compassion, integrity, and diligence" Jane Timken.

On Monday, February 3, Gov. Mike DeWine announced his executive budget proposal for FY 26-27. Included in the proposal was higher taxes on tobacco, sports gambling, and adult-use cannabis. The revenue from the tobacco tax would pay for a new refundable child tax credit and the sports gambling tax increase would help pay for professional sports stadiums and youth sports. The cannabis tax increase would pay for a marijuana possession expungement program, law enforcement training, suicide crisis, drug task force grants, and driver training. In addition, the budget addressed K-12 school funding and higher education funding with an emphasis on employment among graduates. The Ohio House is now considering the Governor's proposal, and some are skeptical of tax increases.

Vice President JD Vance joined Gov. Mike DeWine and Senators Moreno and Husted and EPA Administrator Lee Zeldin to mark the 2-year anniversary of the train derailment in East Palestine. Rail operator Norfolk Southern reached a settlement agreement to pay \$22 million on top of \$13.5 in prior payments.

Ohio Treasurer Robert Sprague announced he was running for secretary of state in 2026, dropping his bid for governor and endorsing Vivek Ramaswamy for governor. In addition, Secretary of State Frank LaRose announced that he will run for auditor. Attorney General Dave Yost officially announced his run for governor.

The Ohio Business Roundtable released a report and a list of recommendations for state lawmakers to improve the state's energy grid, warning the state may not have enough energy for the future given the influx of energy-intensive operations in advanced manufacturing and AI.

Speaker of the House Huffman announced that legislators are working on bills to address property taxes.

Gov. DeWine signed an executive order requiring state employees to return to their offices no later than March 17. Approximately 65% of the state employees are currently fully in office.

Senator Huffman introduced SB 56 which repeals most of the cannabis control law and combines regulations regarding cultivation, processing, dispensing, use, and home grow of adult-use marijuana and medical marijuana into one under the Division of Cannabis Control. Sen. Huffman also introduced SB 86 which would require intoxicating hemp products be available only to those age 21 and in adult-use dispensaries.

Senator Cirino introduced SB 1 which among other things requires state institutions of higher education to prohibit DEI in training, job descriptions, orientation, and contracts with 3rd parties to promote admissions, hiring, or promotion on the basis of race, ethnicity, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression. SB 1 would require state higher education institutions to affirm every position, policy, program, and activity to be based on equal opportunity and would prohibit full-time faculty from striking and instead would require collective bargaining disputes to be resolved by a final offer settlement procedure.
